

The Delaware Public Health District's Partnership for a Healthy Delaware County (The Partnership) wants to hear from YOU!

Currently, The Partnership coalition is conducting its countywide community health assessment (CHA), aimed at evaluating resident health status and health outcomes for all ages. Once all pieces of this assessment are complete, the coalition will then use the data collected to create a Delaware County Health Improvement Plan (CHIP). The health improvement plan will be a guiding document to improve health status and health outcomes for Delaware County residents. The variety of health assessments and data collected from them helps the coalition choose health priorities to focus on over the next several years.

One of the assessments that is part of the process is a Quality-of-Life survey aimed at gathering resident feedback about the quality of life across Delaware County. The survey asks which city/village/township residents reside in, and if there are enough collected responses from each geographical area, subdivisions will be able to get this feedback directly from the Delaware Public Health District. The survey asks residents about their satisfaction related to safety & well-being, access to health care systems, economic opportunities, among other topics. **All responses are anonymous**, and therefore cannot be traced to any one person or individual.
