THIS Second AMENDMENT TO TOWER SITE LICENSE AGREEMENT dated as of the latter of the signature dates below, is by and between Delaware County Board of Commissioners, acting by and through the Department of Emergency Services, having a mailing address of 10 Court Street, Delaware, OH 43015 ("Licensor") and New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, having a mailing address of 1025 Lenox Park Blvd NE, 3rd Floor, Atlanta, GA 30319 ("Licensee").

WHEREAS, Licensor and Licensee, or their respective predecessors-in-interest, entered into a Tower Site License Agreement dated July 6, 2006, and First Amendment to Tower Site License Agreement dated April 28, 2008 (collectively, the "Agreement") whereby Licensor leased to Licensee certain Premises, therein described, that are a portion of the Property located at 238 West Granville Street, Sunbury, OH 43074; and

WHEREAS, Licensor and Licensee desire, in their mutual interest, wish to amend the Agreement as set forth below.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Licensor and Licensee agree as follows:

1. New Premises Area. Licensor agrees to increase the size of the Premises leased to Licensee to accommodate Licensee's needs. Upon the execution of this Amendment, Licensor leases to Licensee the additional premises described on attached Exhibit 1-A ("New Premises Area"). Licensor's execution of this Amendment will signify Licensor's approval of Exhibit 1-A. 2. Generator. Licensee shall have the right to install, repair, maintain, modify, replace, remove, utilize and operate (including but not limited to operate as may be required by applicable law) equipment within the New Premises Area, including without limitation a concrete pad and generator thereon, including back-up power supply. Licensee shall have the right to access the New Premises Area, and any provisions in the Agreement governing access shall apply to such access. The generator shall remain the property of Licensee, and Licensee shall have the right to remove or modify it at any time.

3. Rent. Where applicable law governs how the generator will be used, Licensee may use the generator in the manner set forth in applicable law. Licensee may terminate this Amendment by written notice to Licensor at any time, and the rent increase set forth in Section 3 shall not take effect or shall be cancelled, as applicable, following any such termination. Within one hundred twenty 120 days after termination of this Amendment , Licensee shall remove its equipment from the New Premises Area; provided that any portions of the equipment that Licensee fails to remove within such period and cessation of Licensee's operations at the New Premises Area shall be deemed abandoned. Licensee shall repair any damage, less ordinary wear and tear, to the New Premises Area caused by its removal activities.

Dear Governor DeWine:

As the Delaware County Board of Commissioners, we are writing to express our unanimous support for full funding in the 2022-23 budget for the indigent-defense services that the state is constitutionally obligated to provide.

The need for full reimbursement is great, particularly in a county like Delaware, which continues to grow both in population and in the need for quality indigent defense. As a result of the improved funding for indigent defense in the most recent budget, in October 2020 we authorized the creation of a Public Defender Office so that we could improve the quality of representation provided, while also exercising greater control over the total cost of indigent defense.

The cost of paying independent local attorneys to represent indigent defendants had risen to an untenable level, while the quality of those services declined. The decision to create this office was the direct result of the improved state funding, which made it clear that your office considered improving indigent defense to be an important initiative. We feel we have done our part to fulfill this mission, and we now respectfully call upon the state to honor its initial commitment and help us meet this obligation.

We deeply appreciate the increased funding seen in the most recent budget and, while we recognize that the availability of those monies was curtailed by the budgetary challenges of COVID-19, we are confident that the state and Delaware County both are poised to rebound strongly in the future. Together, we can continue to meet the needs of our citizens and, to that end, we encourage you to make full indigent-defense reimbursements to Ohio's counties a priority once again in the 2022-23 budget.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 121.22(G) of the Revised Code, a public body may hold an executive session only after a majority of a quorum of the public body determines, by a roll call vote, to hold an executive session and only at a regular or special meeting for the sole purpose of the consideration of any of the matters specified in section 121.22(G)(1)-(7) of the Revised Code; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, State of Ohio:

Section 1. The Board hereby adjourns into executive session for consideration of the purchase of property for public purposes.
