THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 15th day of, February by and between the COUNTY OF DELAWARE (acting through its BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS), hereinafter called the COUNTY, and Romanelli and Hughes Building Company, hereinafter called the OWNER, is governed by the following considerations, to wit:

- 1) The OWNER is constructing a development known as Ravines at Hoover (the "Development"), which will include a new roadway access to Tussic Street Rd and contribute to the need for improvements to Tussic Street Rd or other roadways in the vicinity of the Development which shall be constructed by the COUNTY (the "Improvements").

OWNER'S AGREEMENT PROJECT NUMBER: 22136

THIS AGREEMENT, executed on this 15th day of February, 2024, between <u>Pulte Homes of Ohio LLC</u>, hereinafter called "OWNER" and the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DELAWARE COUNTY OHIO (COUNTY COMMISSIONERS), for the project described as <u>Nelson Farms North</u> further identified as Project Number <u>22136</u> is governed by the following considerations to wit:

Said OWNER is to construct, install or otherwise make all public improvements shown and set forth to be done and performed in compliance with the approved engineering drawings and specifications, all of which are a part of this AGREEMENT.

OPTIONS:

- 1. Should OWNER elect to record the plat prior to beginning construction, OWNER shall execute bond, certified check, irrevocable letter of credit, or other approved financial warranties equal to the cost of construction as shown in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- 2. Should OWNER elect to proceed to construction prior to recording the plat, no approved financial warranties are necessary until such time as OWNER elects to record the plat. Such plat cannot be recorded until the County Engineer has determined the construction of the project is at least 80% complete.

OWNER hereby elects to use Option 2 for this project.

The financial warranties are to insure faithful performance of this AGREEMENT and the completion of all improvements in accordance with the Delaware County Design, Construction and Surveying Standards and any supplements thereto. The OWNER shall pay the entire cost and expense of said improvements, unless otherwise specifically noted herein.

The OWNER shall indemnify and save harmless Delaware County and all Townships and/or Villages within Delaware County and all of their officials, employees or agents from all claims, suits, actions and proceedings which may originate from or on account of any death, injuries or damages to persons or property received or sustained as a consequence of any actions or omissions of any contractor or subcontractor or from any material, including explosives, or any method used in said work or by or on account of any accident caused by negligence or any other act or omission of any contractor or his agents or employees.

All public improvement construction shall be performed within one (1) year from the date on which this AGREEMENT is executed by the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

The OWNER further agrees that any violations of or noncompliance with any of the provisions and stipulations of this AGREEMENT shall constitute a breach of contract, and the COUNTY shall have the right to stop work forthwith and act against the performance surety for the purpose of proper completion of the public improvements within this subdivision.

It is further agreed that upon execution of the AGREEMENT, the OWNER shall deposit Thirty- Eight

Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$38,000.00) estimated to be necessary to pay the cost of inspection by the Delaware County Engineer. When the fund has been depleted to ten percent (10%) of the original amount deposited, the OWNER shall replenish the account upon notice by the Engineer. Upon completion of the maintenance period and acceptance of the improvements by the Delaware County Commissioners, the remaining amount in the fund shall be returned to the OWNER.

Upon completion of construction, the OWNER shall be responsible for the maintenance, repair or construction of any and all defective materials or workmanship for a period of one year. Said OWNER'S bond, certified check, irrevocable letter of credit or other approved financial warranties may be reduced to 10% of the originally approved construction estimate as shown in Exhibit "A" for said maintenance. The reduction may be approved only after the County Engineer has been provided evidence that all work has been accomplished according to the approved plan and/or to the County Engineer's satisfaction. All work is to be done in accordance with the Delaware County Design, Construction and Surveying Standards, and any supplements thereto.

Acceptance of the project into the public system shall be completed only after written notice to the C O U N T Y COMMISSIONERS from the County Engineer of his approval. The OWNER'S maintenance responsibility as described above shall be completed upon formal acceptance by the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

Any snow or ice removal, erosion and sediment control maintenance, or other safety requirements deemed necessary by the County Engineer during the period of construction or maintenance shall be the responsibility of the OWNER. All of the funds set forth in the AGREEMENT shall be made available to the County Engineer to ensure proper safety compliance.

The OWNER shall, within thirty (30) days of completion of construction and prior to final acceptance, to the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, as required, "as-built" drawings of the improvements, which plans shall become the property of the COUNTY and remain in the office of the Delaware County Engineer.

The OWNER shall, within thirty (30) days of completion of construction, furnish to the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS an itemized statement showing the cost of improvements and an affidavit that all material and labor costs have been paid.
