





Adult Court Services



The office of Adult Court Services currently supervises over 1,100 clients ordered by the Court to be on community supervision.







Auditor - Fiscal Services

With the completion of the 2022 financial audit, Delaware County has received the GFOA Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for 31 consecutive years reflecting 31 years of clean financial audits submitted to the GFOA. Delaware County was found to be "proficient" in all 17 reporting categories.





Auditor - Data Center



The Data Center completed the upgrade and migration of over 1,200 workstations to the Office 365 platform and completed the installation of Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) to maintain state-of-the-art network security for Delaware County.

Auditor – Real Estate Administration



The REA office completed the sexennial reappraisal of 94,239 parcels. The value of all real property in Delaware County increased to \$38.2 Billion, an increase of 34.5% over 2022. The REA office conducted almost 5,000 informal hearings and made 3,353 value adjustments that resulted from the informal hearings.





Board of Elections

In 2023, Delaware County had an increase of 3,000 registered voters and an increase of 7,800 voters since 2020.

Delaware County added three precincts in 2023, bringing the total to 170 precincts serving 161,201 registered voters.

The Board of Elections oversaw three elections, including two statewide elections.

Delaware County voters turned out to vote! In August the statewide average voter turnout was 39%. In Delaware County, it was 51%.

The November 2023 ballot contained 164 candidates and 28 local questions and issues.









Clerk of Courts - Legal Division

The Clerk's Office is proud to offer the Good Deeds Program again in 2024 in partnership with Juvenile/Probate Judge David Hejmanowski and Recorder Melissa Jordan.

This community outreach program explains how residents can skip Probate Court and designate survivorship and beneficiaries on titled vehicles, boats, and real estate deeds.



The clerk's office began e-filing in 2015 and has processed over 130,000 e-filings from over 10,000 attorneys and private residents who are registered to e-file. Alost 7,000 new cases were filed in 2023.



Clerk of Courts - Title Division

In 2023, the Title Division processed more than 112,000 auto and boat titles for Ohio residents and dealerships. Since 2017, the office has returned in excess of \$1.5M in poundage from sales tax to Delaware County every year.





Common Pleas Court

The Delaware County Common Pleas Court General Division operates two specialized dockets that are certified by the Supreme Court of Ohio and this year offered periodic out-of-court social events to promote positive prosocial engagement by docket participants in the community.

Participants held a team-building event at Stockhands Healing for Horses, volunteered at People in Need, attended a summer cookout at a local park, and enjoyed an indoor winter gathering.


Judge Gormley's Mental Health Docket achieved a recidivism reduction rate of 100%. Also, 67% of participants completed the program.

Judge Schuck's Recovery Docket for those with substance-use disorder achieved a recidivism reduction rate of 83% and had a 57% graduation rate.










Domestic Relations Court

Ohio Supreme Court Chief Justice Sharon Kennedy recognized Judge Fuller and his Settlement Week Program in her 2023 State of the Judiciary Address.

Judge Fuller conducted his 11th Settlement Week, November 13–17, 2023, utilizing mediators from across Central Ohio. For the Fall 2023 Settlement Week, there were seventeen cases included. Of those cases, thirteen cases resulted in a full settlement (76.47%), three cases resulted in a partial settlement (17.65%), and one case did not settle (5.88%).

Assistance is being provided by Judge Fuller's Court, as requested, to those courts across the State of Ohio who are interested in establishing similar programs.

Homeland Security and Emergency Management

In 2023, EMA completed an update of the Delaware County Multi-Hazard Mitigation plan, which was subsequently adopted by all jurisdictions within the County. This strategic plan outlines proposed projects across the County meant to make ensure resilience in the face of possible disasters. Following approval, EMA will now work to support local jurisdictions in pursuing funding to support such projects.













Law Library

The Delaware County Law Library has updated its online card catalogue, reflecting a print collection that contains roughly 1,240 volumes, and staff are rebooting the e-Book collection.

The library has 6 public access computer terminals and offers Westlaw's online database on 3 public access terminals, with software programs such as Puritas for Child Support calculating.

The Delaware County Law Library continues to partner with the Andrews House Legal Advice Clinic and the Ohio Justice Bus to host a Family/Domestic Relations advice clinic on the first Thursday of each month.

The clinic is staffed by local volunteer attorneys and supported by the Justice Bus staff; with prescreening and scheduling by the Andrews House staff and volunteers.









Juvenile/Probate Court

Judge Hejmanowski and the juvenile court staff continue to make the safety and well-being of children in our community their top priority. And because the #1 killer of teenagers in the United States is motor vehicle crashes, the court has continually sought to be a nationwide leader in promoting teen driving safety. The Delaware County Juvenile Court was the first in the nation to implement an on-site teen driver assessment simulator developed by Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, is currently assisting Nationwide Children's Hospital in enrolling teen drivers in ground-breaking driver safety research, has received two



grants from the Ohio Department of Public Safety to enroll Delaware County youth in advanced driver training, and continues to partner with the OSU Extension Office and the Safe Delaware Coalition to get youth into extended teen driver education. This community-wide effort is not without results – 2023 was just the second year this Century without a teen driving fatality anywhere in the county.







Prosecutor

In January, Auditor of State Keith Faber presented Prosecutor Melissa Schiffel with a Public Integrity Award for her involvement with the investigation of theft allegations by former officials at the Columbus Zoo.













Public Defender



In 2023, the Delaware County Public Defender's Office managed 1,600 cases internally, surpassing the previous year's total of 1,300 cases.

For the first time, the office handled more cases in-house than those assigned to courtappointed counsel.

On average, cases handled internally were 17% lower than those outsourced, resulting in substantial cost savings for taxpayers.

These cases encompassed a wide range of offenses, from traffic violations to aggravated murder.













Recorder

The Delaware County
Recorder's Office generated
over \$2 million dollars in 2023,
and sent a statutory \$1 million
to Columbus and the Ohio
Housing Trust Fund.

Deputies processed nearly 800 images a day in 2023!















Regional Planning Commission



In 2023, the Delaware County Regional Planning Commission contributed 584 staff hours in support of project-related work for local projects undertaken by its members.

The office also reviewed 16 different cases as part of its statutory reviews of zoning resolution text amendment cases.













Sheriff




Based on successful partnerships with local school districts and the Board of Commissioners, requests from 3 public school districts were filled to increase School Resource Officer presence from 11 to 17.

The Delaware County Jail earned the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act certifications, achieved only by a handful of jails in Ohio.
