WHEREAS, each year the Little Brown Jug and the Delaware County Fair honor an individual with the Joseph Neville Memorial Award; and
WHEREAS, Robert “Bob” McIntosh, a Hall of Fame trainer and three-time winner of the Jugette, has been

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posthumously awarded the 2025 Neville Award by an international panel of harness racing enthusiasts; and

WHEREAS, McIntosh, who was born in Wheatley, Ontario, began his harness racing journey by helping his father run the family stable and later worked for his older brother before establishing his own stable; and

WHEREAS, with more than 4,600 races won and more than \$92 million in earnings, his stable would become the leading money-winner among Canadian trainers and the fourth all-time in North America; and

WHEREAS, McIntosh is credited with 20 training wins in Delaware from 1992 through 2023, including three Jugette titles, three straight Senior Jug crowns, two Buckettes, two Standardbreds and a Winbak Pace; and

WHEREAS, during his remarkable career, McIntosh was named the O’Brien Award winner as Canada’s Trainer of the Year seven times, the U.S. Trainer of the Year twice, and campaigned three horses that were voted Horse of the Year; and

WHEREAS, McIntosh was inducted into the U.S. Harness Racing Hall of Fame in Goshen, New York, in 2003 and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 2010;

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2025, a Ditch Maintenance Petition for Porshi (the “Petition”) was filed with the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County (the “Board”); and

WHEREAS, the Petition sets forth the drainage improvements that have been or will be constructed within Porshi, 9.68 acres in Orange Township; and

WHEREAS, the petitioners have requested that the drainage improvements be accepted into the Delaware County Drainage Maintenance Program and that an annual maintenance assessment be collected with the real estate taxes for the improvements in the subject lot to cover the cost of current and future maintenance of the improvements; and

WHEREAS, the petitioners represent 100% of the property owners to be assessed for maintenance related to this drainage improvement and have waived their rights to a public viewing and hearing; and

WHEREAS, based on a review of the Petition and all accompanying documents, the Board has determined that the improvements satisfy all statutory criteria pursuant to Chapters 6131 and 6137 of the Revised Code and all criteria for acceptance into the Delaware County Drainage Maintenance Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County, Ohio:

Section 1. The Board hereby grants the Petition, the Board having found and determined that the improvements satisfy all statutory criteria pursuant to Chapters 6131 and 6137 of the Revised Code and all criteria for acceptance into the Delaware County Drainage Maintenance Program.

Section 2. The Board hereby approves the maintenance assessments, in accordance with the Petition, as follows:

The cost of the drainage improvements is \$120,599.82 and a detailed cost estimate is attached. The drainage improvements are being constructed for the benefit of the condominium units being created in this development. The developed condominium area of 19 units will receive benefits (cost) of the project on a per acre basis. The basis for calculating the assessment for each condominium unit is therefore, \$6,347.36 per unit. An annual maintenance fee equal to 2% of this basis (\$126.95) will be collected for each developed condominium unit. We (I) understand that the basis for calculating the maintenance assessment will be reviewed and possibly revised every 6 years. The first year’s assessment for all of the lots in the amount of \$2,412.05 has been paid to Delaware County.

WHEREAS, the Engineer recommends approving the Owner's Agreement for Honey Grove;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Delaware County Board of Commissioners approves the Owner's Agreement for Honey Grove as follows:

OWNER'S AGREEMENT
PROJECT NUMBER: 25036

THIS AGREEMENT, executed on this 15th day of September, 2025, between Pulte Homes of Ohio LLC, hereinafter called "OWNER" and the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DELAWARE COUNTY OHIO (COUNTY COMMISSIONERS), for the project described as Honey Grove (NorthStar Wilson Rd) further identified as Project Number 25036 is governed by the following considerations to wit:

Said OWNER is to construct, install or otherwise make all public improvements shown and set forth to be done and performed in compliance with the approved engineering drawings and specifications, all of which are a part of this AGREEMENT.

OPTIONS:

1. Should OWNER elect to record the plat prior to beginning construction, OWNER shall execute bond, certified check, irrevocable letter of credit, or other approved financial warranties equal to the cost of construction as shown in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
2. Should OWNER elect to proceed to construction prior to recording the plat, no approved financial warranties are necessary until such time as OWNER elects to record the plat. Such plat cannot be recorded until the County Engineer has determined the construction of the project is at least 80% complete.

OWNER hereby elects to use Option 1 for this project.

The financial warranties are to insure faithful performance of this AGREEMENT and the completion of all improvements in accordance with the Delaware County Design, Construction and Surveying Standards and any supplements thereto. The OWNER shall pay the entire cost and expense of said improvements, unless otherwise specifically noted herein.

The OWNER shall indemnify and save harmless Delaware County and all Townships and/or Villages within Delaware County and all of their officials, employees or agents from all claims, suits, actions and proceedings which may originate from or on account of any death, injuries or damages to persons or property received or sustained as a consequence of any actions or omissions of any contractor or subcontractor or from any material, including explosives, or any method used in said work or by or on account of any accident caused by negligence or any other act or omission of any contractor or his agents or employees.

All public improvement construction shall be performed within one (1) year from the date on which this AGREEMENT is executed by the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

The OWNER further agrees that any violations of or noncompliance with any of the provisions and stipulations of this AGREEMENT shall constitute a breach of contract, and the COUNTY shall have the right to stop work forthwith and act against the performance surety for the purpose of proper completion of the public improvements within this subdivision.

It is further agreed that upon execution of the AGREEMENT, the OWNER shall deposit Seventy Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$70,000.00) estimated to be necessary to pay the cost of inspection by the Delaware County Engineer. When the fund has been depleted to ten percent (10%) of the original amount deposited, the OWNER shall replenish the account upon notice by the Engineer. Upon completion of the maintenance period and acceptance of the improvements by the Delaware County Commissioners, the remaining amount in the fund shall be returned to the OWNER.

Upon completion of construction, the OWNER shall be responsible for the maintenance, repair or construction of any and all defective materials or workmanship for a period of one year. Said OWNER'S bond, certified check, irrevocable letter of credit or other approved financial warranties may be reduced to 10% of the originally approved construction estimate as shown in Exhibit "A" for said maintenance. The reduction may be approved only after the County Engineer has been provided evidence that all work has been accomplished according to the approved plan and/or to the County Engineer's satisfaction. All work is to be done in accordance with the Delaware County Design, Construction and Surveying Standards, and any supplements thereto.

Acceptance of the project into the public system shall be completed only after written notice to the

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COUNTY COMMISSIONERS from the County Engineer of his approval. The OWNER'S maintenance responsibility as described above shall be completed upon formal acceptance by the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

Any snow or ice removal, erosion and sediment control maintenance, or other safety requirements deemed necessary by the County Engineer during the period of construction or maintenance shall be the responsibility of the OWNER. All of the funds set forth in the AGREEMENT shall be made available to the County Engineer to ensure proper safety compliance.

The OWNER shall, within thirty (30) days of completion of construction and prior to final acceptance, to the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, as required, "as-built" drawings of the improvements, which plans shall become the property of the COUNTY and remain in the office of the Delaware County Engineer.

The OWNER shall, within thirty (30) days of completion of construction, furnish to the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS an itemized statement showing the cost of improvements and an affidavit that all material and labor costs have been paid. The OWNER shall indemnify and hold harmless Delaware County and all Townships and/or Villages within and all their officials, employees or agents from expenses or claims for labor or material incident to said construction of improvements.

The OWNER shall obtain all other necessary utility services incident to the construction of the improvements and for their continued operation. The OWNER shall be responsible for all utility charges and installation costs. The utility user charges shall be paid by the OWNER and maintained in continuous use throughout the construction and testing phases until accepted for operation and maintenance by the County.

Should the OWNER become unable to carry out the provisions of this AGREEMENT, the OWNER'S heirs, successors or assigns shall complete and comply with all applicable terms, conditions, provisions and requirements of this AGREEMENT.

In consideration whereof, the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO hereby grants the OWNER or his agent, the right and privilege to make the improvements stipulated herein.

WHEREAS, the Engineer has reviewed the roadway construction of the roads in Clark Shaw Reserve (the “Subdivision”), finds it to be constructed in accordance with the approved plans, and recommends that the following roadways within the Subdivision be accepted into the public system:

- An addition of 0.099 mile to Township Road number 1922 Roland Way
