RESOLUTION NO. 07-886

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING AN EMS SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND THE CITY OF DELAWARE:

It was moved by Mr. Jordan, seconded by Mr. Ward to approve the following agreement:

AN AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE EMS SERVICE WITHIN THE CITY OF DELAWARE AND DELAWARE COUNTY

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the City of Delaware, hereinafter called the "City," and The County of Delaware, hereinafter called the "County," pursuant to the authority of Section 307.15 of the Ohio Revised Code, that provides that, the County may enter into with the legislative authority of any municipal corporation, whereby it undertakes, and is authorized by the Board of Commissioners, to exercise any power, perform any function, or render any service, in behalf of the County or the Board of Commissioners, that the County or the Board may exercise, perform or render.

WHEREAS, by mutual agreement, the City, since 1972, has provided Emergency Medical Service (EMS) on behalf of the County in certain areas of the County, and:

WHEREAS, by mutual agreement, the County has provided EMS on behalf of the City in certain areas of the City;

WHEREAS, the City and County are committed to continue providing EMS to all residents of the City and County, and;

WHEREAS, the City and the County have a desire to compensate the City at a "per-run" rate for the EMS service; and

WHEREAS, a "Run" shall be defined as a single medical incident, regardless of the number of EMS or other apparatus that respond(s);

NOW THEREFORE, the City and County agree compensation will be as follows:

- 1. That upon the effective date of this agreement, the compensation payable by the County to the City for EMS shall be based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) as a yearly multiple at a per-run rate of \$176.36 (a CPI rate of 3.2%) each for FY2006, less those payments already made, and at a rate of \$180.59 (a CPI rate of 2.4%) for FY2007 on all transports. The full per-run rate will be paid for transports and non-transports for 2006. In 2007, a non-transport rate will go into effect at \$90.30 per run. The City will provide the County with an invoice beginning in the second quarter of the year for those runs conducted in the first quarter of the year. The invoice will annotate the total number of runs, transport and non-transport, and the total cost for the quarter. In addition, the City will include a CAD, or similar printout, that reflects the date, time, unit(s) and disposition for each run. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for this agreement was as reported by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics for the Midwest area during 2005 and 2006. The 2008 reimbursement rate increase will be based on the CPI for 2007 as reported by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics for the Midwest area.
- 2. It is also agreed that minor changes in the area to be served by the City to the County and by the County to the City are contemplated at the onset by the Parties, and the authority to do so will be delegated by the Parties so that such changes may be done on an administrative level by the City of Delaware Fire Chief and the Delaware County EMS Chief as necessary during the terms of this agreement. The City and County response areas will be designated for coverage based on the **closest responding unit** as depicted and agreed to on the attached map, thus expediting timely service to residents:
 - a. If the City of Delaware Medic vehicle arrives on scene, but does not transport, then it will be compensated at the non-transport rate.
 - b. There will be no compensation made to the City of Delaware if their Medic vehicle is cancelled prior to arrival.
- 3. That the County will provide to the City, or the City to the County, upon written request and notwithstanding

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any HIPAA restrictions, an electronic copy of each run taken within the corporation limits of the City of Delaware within a reasonable time of the call.

- 4. That the City agrees that it will provide its medic employees with the same level of training, or greater, than that provided to County EMS employees.
- 5. That the Parties agree to jointly review and analyze the results of this agreement, improving efficiencies, avoiding duplications and defining and recommending the terms of a new Agreement to succeed this one.
- 6. This Agreement shall be in force and effect from and after its execution, and shall terminate on December 31, 2008.
