2008 Delaware County Recycling and Litter Prevention Report to DKMM Solid Waste District

The Delaware General Health District's Keep Delaware County Beautiful (KDCB) program provided 53 presentations to 2284 students in 2008. These presentations included recycling and "No Garbage Lunch" presentations to 4th grade students attending "Hand On The Land", "Paper Recycling", Vermicomposting, and Mining and Natural Resources activities.

Three teacher workshops were held at Highbanks Metro Parks in cooperation with the Delaware Environmental partnership (DEEP) with 61 teachers attending. The topics of the three workshops were Energy, Science and Stories, and Schoolyard Science. KDCB incorporated recycling, composting, and litter prevention activities into these workshops. KDCB provided and additional four presentations to 95 adults, including the annual Recognition Reception.

Keep Delaware County Beautiful provided informational displays at the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium's Earth Day event, the Water Fest at Gallant Preserve, Grady Hospital, Home Depot Eco Event, and the Delaware General Health District's District Advisory Council meeting. KDCB worked with the Health District's Public Information Officer to provide a information to residents about recycling and litter prevention, including storm debris disposal, drop off events, and activities.

KDCB completed a \$10,000 grant from Keep America Beautiful and Waste Management to put a rain garden in Shawnee Hills. KDCB is working with Delaware County Soil and Water on this project that will provide workshops and clean water shed education to Delaware County residents. The rain garden program's desired effect will be to reduce storm water run off, erosion and pollution in the Scioto watershed and reduce silt which causes lost capacity in the reservoir; and creating an educational tool for residents of the village, county, and Central Ohio.

In 2008, KDCB worked with townships and villages to hold the Great American Clean Up litter collection

event. 541 volunteers collected 31,126 pounds of litter from Delaware County roadsides and public spaces. Also in the spring, KDCB worked with the DKMM Solid Waste District to offer an Appliance, Computer and Record Shredding Drop Off. Residents dropped off 119 appliances, 7.38 tons of e-waste, and more than a ton of records were shredded. The annual Senior Citizen Appliance Pick Up was held. A \$8,000 grant from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and match funds from the Council for Older Adults, and the Delaware General Health District enabled KDCB to collect televisions and electronics as well as appliances. KDCB was able to serve 241 seniors. A total of 174 televisions, 217 appliances, and 220 computers/electronics were collected. The Juvenile Court and Adult Court Services Crews had 303 participants who collected approximately 3 1/2 tons of litter from county and township roadways and public parks and right-of-ways.

In the fall, a river clean up was held on the northern section of the Scioto River in Radnor Township. Fifty volunteers collected 2 tons of trash including 100 tires. In October, KDCB worked with the DKMM Solid Waste District to hold the Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off at the Delaware County Fairgrounds. The two day event was the smoothest ever held in Delaware County. The results were 865 vehicles that brought in 25,602 pounds of computers, 4265 tires, and 150,063 pounds of other chemicals, etc.

KDCB answered more than a thousand phone calls and emails regarding recycling and litter prevention topics. KDCB handled schedule changes of the recycling drop offs and provided desk side recycling containers to schools and community organizations. KDCB also provided can and bottle recycling boxes organizations.
