WHEREAS, the City of Delaware, Ohio has been designated as the Lead Community responsible for administering the grant provided from the State of Ohio Department of Development to implement project activities identified in Delaware County Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP), as a result of the enactment of Title III of Division B of the Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2008 (HERA); and
