This Agreement is made between the City of Powell, Ohio (the "City"), the Delaware County Commissioners, Delaware County, Ohio (the "County"), and the Liberty Township Trustees, Liberty Township, Delaware County, Ohio (the "Township") (individually "Party" and City, Township, and County collectively "Parties").

Whereas, storm sewer improvements which straddle the boundary between the City and the Township have been installed under Hunter's Bend ("Improvements") to service the Reserve at Scioto Glen development within the City of Powell; and,

Whereas, the Parties desire to provide consistent and efficient ongoing maintenance of the Improvements for the public health, safety, and welfare of the community.

- A. The City shall maintain the Improvements. This maintenance obligation shall not expire unless this Agreement is terminated as provided herein.
- B. In maintaining the Improvements, the City shall fully comply with all federal, state, and local statutes, rules, regulations, orders, and/or restrictions applicable to the Improvements.
- C. The County and Township have the option to make improvements to the Improvements if needed or desired as part of any development in adjacent Liberty Township, provided that such shall be coordinated through the City Engineer.
- D. The County shall advise the City in advance of any improvements to the segment of Hunter's Bend adjacent to the Improvements and may receive prior input from the City on any such improvements, but is not obligated to accept such input or obtain approval of the City prior to making any such improvements.

This Agreement may be terminated for convenience at any time and for any reason upon the mutual written agreement of all of the Parties or upon breach by any non-breaching Party, but only after the non-breaching Party provides notice of the breach to all other Parties and allows the breaching Party a reasonable opportunity to remedy the breach.

The Parties are political subdivisions of the State of Ohio and lack authority to indemnify. Therefore, each Party is and shall be responsible for their own actions, and/or the actions of their respective council members, board members, officers, employees, agents, representatives, and/or volunteers resulting from or related to the maintenance of the Improvements and/or the performance of this Agreement. In so doing, and to the extent permitted by law, the Parties agree to hold the other Parties harmless.

This Agreement does not require the expenditure of any County or Township funds.

The Parties agree that the goods, services, and benefits received by each Party pursuant to this Agreement are good and valuable consideration and that this Agreement is supported by sufficient good and valuable consideration. The Parties agree not to challenge this Agreement on the basis of a lack of consideration.

The provisions of this Agreement are severable and independent, and if any such provision shall be unenforceable in whole or in part, the remaining provisions and any partially enforceable provisions, to the extent enforceable, shall nevertheless be binding and enforceable.

This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio. Any and all legal disputes arising from this Agreement shall be filed in and heard before the courts of Delaware County, Ohio.

The Parties are authorized to enter this Agreement by, including, but not limited to, R.C. § 9.482 and, with respect to the City, Article XVIII, Section 3 of the Ohio Constitution.

This Agreement may be executed in counterparts.

This Agreement shall constitute the entire understanding and agreement between the Parties, shall supersede all prior understandings and agreements, whether written or oral, between the Parties relating to the subject matter hereof, and may only be amended in writing with the mutual consent and agreement of the Parties.

The Parties acknowledge and agree that this Agreement is not effective until approved by formal action of the governing bodies of the respective Parties and shall only take effect upon such approval.

It is the Customer's responsibility to initiate a request for refund in such instances and the Customer can contact the Company at any time to investigate their eligibility for a refund as development proceeds in their local area.

This Agreement is made and entered into this 18th day of December, 2017, by and between the **Delaware County Board of Commissioners**, Delaware County, Ohio, 101 North Sandusky Street, Delaware, Ohio 43015 ("County"), and **Trans Associates Engineering Consultants, Inc.**, 941 Chatham Lane, Suite 319, Columbus, Ohio 43221, ("Consultant"), hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties", and shall be known as the "Prime Agreement."

1 SERVICES PROVIDED BY CONSULTANT

- 1.1 The Consultant will provide "Services" in connection with the following "Project": Steitz Road Improvements, Phase 2 (DEL-CR125-1.46, PID 1306), a minor widening project from 1775' north of Home Road (CR124) to just south of the intersection with Hyatts Road (CR 123).
- 1.2 The Consultant shall perform the Services promptly and with the ordinary degree of skill and care that would be used by other reasonably competent practitioners of the same discipline practicing in the same locale and under similar circumstances.
- 1.3 Services shall be rendered by the Consultant in accordance with the following documents, to be retained and on file with each Party, and by this reference made part of this Agreement:
 - 1.3.1 Scope of Services last revised: November 28, 2017
 - 1.3.2 Fee Proposal last revised: December 7, 2017

2 SUPERVISION OF SERVICES

- 2.1 The Delaware County Board of Commissioners hereby designates the Delaware County Engineer as the "Project Manager" and agent of the County for this Agreement.
- 2.2 The Project Manager shall have authority to review and order changes, commencement, suspension or termination of the Services performed under this Agreement.

3 AGREEMENT AND MODIFICATIONS

3.1 This Agreement, and those documents incorporated by reference herein, shall constitute the entire understanding and agreement between the County and the Consultant, shall supersede all prior understandings and agreements relating to the Project, and may only be modified or amended in writing with the mutual consent and agreement of the Parties.

- 4.2 The Project Manager may authorize partial lump sum payments for itemized tasks in "If Authorized Services" with written consent of the Consultant when the Project Manager determines the necessity therefor.
- 4.3 Total compensation under this Agreement shall not exceed \$387,765.00 without subsequent modification by both Parties.
- 4.4 The fees specified above shall constitute full compensation for all direct labor, payroll burden, general and administrative overhead, profit, travel, equipment, and materials necessary to complete the tasks as set forth in the Scope of Services.

5 NOTICES

5.1 "Notices" issued under this Agreement shall be served to the Parties listed below in writing. The Parties may use electronic communication for the purposes of general communication; however, email shall not be used to transmit Notices.

6 PAYMENT

- 6.1 Compensation shall be paid periodically, but no more than once per month, based on invoices submitted by the Consultant and approved by the County Engineer, and shall be based on the calculated percentage of Services performed to date in accordance with the Consultant's Price Proposal.
- 6.2 Invoices shall be submitted to the Project Manager by the Consultant on company letterhead clearly listing the word "Invoice" with a sequential invoice number provided. The County may request additional documentation to substantiate said invoices and the Consultant shall promptly submit documentation as needed to substantiate said invoices.

6.3 The County shall pay invoices within thirty (30) days of receipt.

7 NOTICE TO PROCEED; COMPLETION; DELAYS AND EXTENSIONS

- 7.1 The Consultant shall commence Services upon written Notice to Proceed ("Authorization") by the Project Manager and shall complete the Services by June 15, 2019.
- 7.2 Consultant shall not proceed with any "If Authorized" tasks without written Authorization.
- 7.3 In the event that unforeseen and unavoidable delays prevent the timely completion of this Agreement, the Consultant may make a written request for time extension, and the Project Manager may grant such an extension provided that all other terms of the Agreement are adhered to.

8 SUSPENSION OR TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- 8.1 The County, upon written Notice as specified in Section 5, may suspend or terminate this Agreement at any time for the convenience of the County, at which time the Consultant shall immediately suspend or terminate Services, as ordered by the County.
- 8.2 In the case of Termination, the Consultant shall submit a final invoice within sixty (60) days of receiving Notice of Termination for Services completed up to the date of termination. The County is not liable for payment for Services performed after the date of termination.

9 CHANGE IN SCOPE OF SERVICES

9.1 In the event that significant changes to the Scope of Services are required during performance of the Services, the first party shall notify the second party in writing with a detailed explanation of the circumstances believed to have changed beyond those originally contemplated by this Agreement. Any subsequent modifications to this Agreement shall be approved by both parties.

10 OWNERSHIP

- 10.1 Upon completion or termination of the Agreement, the Consultant shall provide copies, if so requested, to the County of all documents or electronic files produced under this Agreement.
- 10.2 The County shall have ownership of said documents, which are considered, but not limited to, any completed or partially completed surveys, calculations, reports, schematics, drawings and any other tangible written or electronic work produced in accordance with the Agreement.
- 10.3 This section does not require unauthorized duplication of copyrighted materials.

11 CHANGE OF KEY CONSULTANT STAFF; ASSIGNMENT

- 11.1 The Consultant shall immediately notify the County, in writing, of any change to key Consultant staff or subconsultants assigned to the Services as contemplated at the time of executing this Agreement.
- The Consultant shall not assign or transfer this Agreement, or any of the rights, responsibilities, or remedies contained herein, to any other party without the express, written consent of the County.

12 INDEMNIFICATION

12.1 The Consultant shall indemnify and hold free and harmless Delaware County and its officials and employees from any and all damages, injury, costs, expenses, judgments or decrees, or any other liabilities that they may incur as a result of bodily injury, sickness, disease or death or injury to or destruction of tangible property including the loss of use resulting therefrom, to the proportionate extent caused by any negligent acts, errors or omissions of the Consultant, its employees, agents, subcontractors, and their employees and agents' subcontractors and their employees or any other person for whose acts any of them may be liable.

13 INSURANCE

- 13.1 <u>General Liability Coverage</u>: Consultant shall maintain commercial general liability insurance of \$1,000,000 each occurrence with an annual aggregate of \$2,000,000. Identical coverage shall be required to be provided by all subcontractors, if any.
- 13.2 <u>Automobile Liability Coverage</u>: Consultant shall maintain automobile liability insurance of \$1,000,000 each accident. Such coverage shall include coverage for owned, hired and non-owned automobiles. Identical coverage shall be required to be provided by all subcontractors, if any.

- 13.3 <u>Workers' Compensation Coverage</u>: Consultant shall maintain workers' compensation coverage as required by the laws of the State of Ohio. Identical coverage shall be required to be provided by all subcontractors, if any.

Consultant also agrees that, as an independent contractor, Consultant assumes all responsibility for any federal, state, municipal, or other tax liabilities along with workers compensation, unemployment compensation, and insurance premiums that may accrue as a result of compensation received for services or deliverables rendered hereunder. Consultant hereby certifies that it has five or more employees and that none of the employees are public employees for purposes of Chapter 145 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- 14.3 <u>Governing Law</u>: This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio. Any and all legal disputes arising from this Agreement shall be filed in and heard before the courts of Delaware County, Ohio.
- 14.4 <u>Headings</u>: The subject headings of the Sections and Subsections in this Agreement are included for purposes of convenience only and shall not affect the construction or interpretation of any of its provisions. This Agreement shall be deemed to have been drafted by both Parties and no purposes of interpretation shall be made to the contrary.
- 14.5 <u>Waivers</u>: No waiver of breach of any provision of this Agreement shall in any way constitute a waiver of any prior, concurrent, subsequent, or future breach of this Agreement or any other provision hereof. No term or provision of this Agreement shall be deemed waived, and no breach excused, unless such a waiver or consent is expressly made in writing and signed by the party claimed to have waived or consented. Such waiver shall not constitute and shall not in any way be interpreted as a waiver of any other term or provision or future breach unless said waiver expressly states an intention to waive another specific term or provision or future breach.
- 14.6 <u>Severability</u>: If any item, condition, portion, or section of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person, premises, or circumstance shall to any extent, be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder hereof and the application of such term, condition, provision, or section to persons, premises, or circumstances other than those as to whom it shall be held invalid or unenforceable shall not be affected thereby, and this Agreement and all the terms, conditions, provisions, or sections hereof shall, in all other respects, continue to be effective and to be complied with.

- 14.9 <u>County Policies</u>: The Consultant shall adhere to all applicable Delaware County policies, including, but not limited to, the following: Discrimination Policy, Ethics Policy, Contractor Safety Policy. The

Consultant shall require any and all of its boards, board members, officials, employees, representatives, agents, and/or volunteers performing Services under this Agreement and/or for or on behalf of the County to comply with all applicable Delaware County policies and shall be responsible for such compliance. The County may, in its sole discretion, immediately terminate this Agreement for failure of the Consultant to comply with this Subsection. WHEREAS, the total appropriations from each fund shall not exceed the total of the estimated revenue available for expenditure therefrom, as certified by the budget commission; and

WHEREAS, the revenues stated herein are derived from the current official certificate of estimated resources and are subject to change, without further action by the Board, upon the budget commission's issuance of an amended official certificate of estimated resources; and

WHEREAS, the Deputy County Administrator/Office of Management & Budget and the County Administrator and have prepared and submitted this Resolution and jointly recommend its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, State of Ohio, that the Year 2018 Appropriations be approved as follows:

IN THE MATTER OF ADJOURNING INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION FOR CONSIDERATION OF EMPLOYMENT; COMPENSATION OF A PUBLIC EMPLOYEE OR PUBLIC OFFICIAL; TO CONSIDER THE PURCHASE OF PROPERTY FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES; FOR PENDING OR IMMINENT LITIGATION; FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AND CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION RELATED TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

It was moved by Mr. Merrell, seconded by Mrs. Lewis to approve the following:

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 121.22(G) of the Revised Code, a public body may hold an executive session only after a majority of a quorum of the public body determines, by a roll call vote, to hold an executive session and only at a regular or special meeting for the sole purpose of the consideration of any of the matters specified in section 121.22(G)(1)–(7) of the Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 121.22(G)(8) of the Revised Code, a public body may hold an executive session to consider confidential information related to the marketing plans, specific business strategy, production techniques, trade secrets, or personal financial statements of an applicant for economic development assistance, or to negotiations with other political subdivisions respecting requests for economic development assistance, provided that both of the following conditions apply:

- (1) The information is directly related to a request for economic development assistance that is to be provided or administered under any provision of Chapter 715., 725., 1724., or 1728. or sections 701.07, 3735.67 to 3735.70, 5709.40 to 5709.43, 5709.61 to 5709.69, 5709.73 to 5709.75, or 5709.77 to 5709.81 of the Revised Code, or that involves public infrastructure improvements or the extension of utility services that are directly related to an economic development project; and
- (2) A unanimous quorum of the public body determines, by a roll call vote, that the executive session is necessary to protect the interests of the applicant or the possible investment or expenditure of public funds to be made in connection with the economic development project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Delaware County, State of Ohio:

Section 1. The Board hereby adjourns into executive session for consideration of compensation of a public employee or public official; to consider the purchase of property for public purposes; for pending or imminent litigation; for collective bargaining and confidential information related to economic development.

Section 2. The Board hereby adjourns into executive session to consider confidential information related to the marketing plans, specific business strategy, production techniques, trade secrets, or personal financial statements of an applicant for economic development assistance, or to negotiations with other political subdivisions respecting requests for economic development assistance.

Section 3. The Board hereby finds and determines that the information listed in Section 2 is directly related to a request for economic development assistance that is to be provided or administered under any provision of Chapter 715., 725., 1724., or 1728. or sections 701.07, 3735.67 to 3735.70, 5709.40 to 5709.43, 5709.61 to 5709.69, 5709.73 to 5709.75, or 5709.77 to 5709.81 of the Revised Code, or that involves public infrastructure improvements or the extension of utility services that are directly related to an economic development project.

Section 4. The Board hereby finds and determines that the executive session held pursuant to Section 2 is necessary to protect the interests of an applicant for economic development assistance or the possible investment or expenditure of public funds to be made in connection with the economic development project.
